### A1 (Elementary)

You can understand and use familiar everyday expressions. You can introduce yourself and others and can ask and answer questions about personal details such as where you live, people you know and things you have. You can interact in a simple way if the other person talks slowly and clearly and is prepared to help.

### A2 (Pre-intermediate)

You can understand sentences and frequently-used expressions related to your daily life. You can communicate in simple tasks requiring a simple and direct exchange of information on familiar and routine matters. You can describe in simple terms aspects of your background and immediate environment.

### B1 (Intermediate)

You can understand the main points when topics are familiar to you. You can deal with most situations while travelling in an area where the language is spoken. You can produce simple connected text on topics that are familiar or of personal interest. You can describe experiences and events, dreams, hopes and ambitions and briefly give reasons and explanations for opinions and plans.

### B2 (Upper intermediate)

You can understand the main ideas of complex text, including technical discussions in your field of specialisation. You can interact with some fluency and spontaneity that makes regular interaction with native speakers quite possible without strain for either party. You can produce clear, text on a wide range of subjects and explain a viewpoint on a topical issue giving the advantages and disadvantages of various options

### C1 (Advanced)

You can understand a wide range of demanding, longer texts, and recognise implicit meaning. You can express ideas fluently and spontaneously. You can use language flexibly and effectively for social, academic and professional purposes. You can produce clear, well-structured, detailed text on complex subjects, showing controlled use of organisational patterns, connectors and cohesive devices.

### C2 (Proficiency)

You can understand with ease virtually everything heard or read. You can summarise information from different spoken and written sources, reconstructing arguments and accounts in a coherent presentation.

You can express yourself spontaneously, very fluently and precisely, differentiating finer shades of meaning even in the most complex situations.
